HUNDREDS OF YEARS AGO, MUCH OF EUROPE WAS COVERED BY ENORMOUS BEECH TREE FORESTS.

Many of these forests still exist, and their ancient trees, aged more than one hundred years old and featuring the world's largest and tallest trees, can be found in eighteen different countries.

Many of the animal families living in these these forests are as old as the trees.


DID YOU SPOT ALL OF THE MASTERS OF DISGUISE?

RED FOX 'Vulpes vulpes

Red fox homes — called dens — are usually on the edges of forests, near fields where there is plenty of prey for them to hunt.

EUROPEAN DORMOUSE Glis glis

This mouse looks a bit like a squirrel, and its long bushy tail helps it to balance in trees.

BROWN HARE Lepus europaeus


Unlike rabbits, brown hares do not dig burrows.

Did you see me hiding in the tall grass behind the pony?


WESTERN CAPERCAILLIE Tetrao urogallus

Female western capercaillie is smaller than the colourful male, and her plumage keeps her well hidden.

Notes on... THE GREAT BARRIER REEF

THE GREAT BARRIER REEF, OFF THE NORTHEAST COAST OF AUSTRALIA. IS MORE THAN 1.400 MILES LONG! IT'S THE WORLD'S LARGEST CORAL REEF.

It's home to 400 species of coral, which form the biggest collection in the world. There are also 1,500 different types of fish and 4,000 kinds of molluscs. It's an important habitat for rare species such as the dugong and the green turtle, which are threatened with extinction.

Many animals that live here have perfected the art of disguise, camouflaging themselves against the reef's bright colours.
