Early book sharing across health, education and the arts

Tuesday 5th March 2019, Crescent Arts Centre, Belfast

Introduction

On The Same Page brought together 125 policy influencers, corporate partners, authors and sector leaders to discuss early children's book sharing across the health, education and arts sectors in Northern Ireland.

The conference was a celebration of cross departmental working and discussion about the importance of early book sharing, and the impact that it is having on children across Northern Ireland. Speakers from the Department of Education, Public Health Agency, BookTrust, The Arts Council of Northern Ireland and children's authors and illustrators shared policy and practice showing how working together towards a common goal can positively impact a child's reading journey.

BookTrust's vision is to get every child reading for pleasure. BookTrust wants every child in Northern Ireland to have the opportunities and support to read for pleasure and to experience the benefits of reading for pleasure from a very early age.

The conference was organised by BookTrust with support from Arts Council Northern Ireland.





The benefits of reading for pleasure and early book sharing

The day began with a welcome from Koulla Yiasouma, the NI Commissioner for Children & Young People. She referenced Article 31 from the Convention on the Rights of the Child - that children have the right to relax and play, and noted how the work of BookTrust contributes to this.

Liz Canning, BookTrust's Head of Country in Northern Ireland, took the opportunity to thank all of BookTrust Northern Ireland's partners, without whom our work would not be possible. Northern Ireland does not have the universal funding that government provides in England and Wales so we identify diverse pots of funding to reach disadvantaged families who need us most.

BookTrust Head of Research Kelly Walsh presented research around early book sharing, giving delegates an overview of the benefits of reading for pleasure and early book sharing, which include supporting language and literary skills, brain development, bonding, social-economic development and well-being . She showed how this research informs different programmes that BookTrust run, such as Bookstart Baby, Time to Read and The Letterbox Club. "A love of reading helps children to get the best start in life so it is critical that our children are given every opportunity to enter the world of literature."

Helen Wales, BookTrust Cymru presented the reading journey available to children in Wales aged 0-5, comprising of Bookstart and the Pori Drwy Stori programme. She discussed how oracy is the term used in Wales within schools for speaking and listening, encompassing speaking, listening, language development and communication. Helen shared the new Pori Drwy Stori programme for children in Nursery, which supports oracy development through sharing rhymes and quality shared reading experiences. This programme has 3 specific aims:



1) to improve oracy-related outcomes for children.

2) to increase parent/carer's engagement with their child's learning, specifically in relation to activities which support oracy outcomes.

3) to increase practitioner's knowledge and understanding of how they can improve oracy outcomes for children, especially by engaging parents and carers.





Keynote Speaker: Dan Freedman

Dan spoke to our delegates about his reading journey, and how his passion for football naturally led to a love of reading for pleasure.





Policy and Practice : Health, Education, Arts

Siobhan Slavin from the Public Health Agency discussed the Early Intervention Transformation Strategy (EITP), notably how it aims to equip parents with the skills to give their child the best start in life, and the role that books and shared reading plays in the EITP.

EITP aims to transform ways of embedding early intervention knowledge and evidence based approaches to commissioning and delivering services for children, young people and families in order to achieve better outcomes.

Cathy Galway, Director of Youth, Education and Childcare, Department of Education, shared strategies that contribute to improving the educational outcomes of children in Northern Ireland, including the EITP, and highlighted the importance of early reading:





Creativity In Practice

Myra Zepf curated an entertaining and informative session as she brought local talent together to give some insight into the creative process:

- Myra spoke about how choosing the right book can make all the difference and had everyone involved as she read *I say Ooh You say Aah* by John Kane.
- Andrew Whitson demonstrated the importance of visual literacy and led a draw along of *Rita*, the character he created for the book written by Myra Zepf.
- Kelly McCaughrain showed us how to make black-out poems with a page from her novel, *Flying Tips for Flightless Birds*.

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
