BookTrust Cymru's annual Big Welsh Rhyme Time is back to help children in Wales enjoy the benefits of bilingual rhyming

- Thousands of children to share rhymes, poems and stories in more than 500 nurseries, schools, libraries and at home across Wales.
- Big Welsh Rhyme Time is funded by the Welsh Government and supports children's language and social development, their familial bonds and their relationship with reading.
- Families are invited to take part at home using new bilingual rhymes, poems and songs available on the BookTrust Cymru website: with a specially created poem from children's author and former Bardd Plant Cymru, Casia Wiliam.

05/02/2024 – BookTrust Cymru, the children's reading charity, is encouraging families, schools, and early years spaces across Wales to join in with **Big Welsh Rhyme Time**, a week-long national celebration of sharing bilingual rhymes, poems and songs with thousands of children in their early years.

Developed with the support of the Welsh Government, Big Welsh Rhyme Time invites families across Wales to experience how rhyming and sharing stories bilingually can be incorporated into everyday life – be it at home, an early years setting, or within their local community. More than 500 settings across Wales have signed up to take part in Big Welsh Rhyme Time, which takes place from **Monday 5**th **February-Friday 9**th **February 2024.** Participating settings include nurseries, primary schools, children and family centres, libraries, childminders, community groups and charities.

By encouraging children to enjoy rhymes during their early years, Big Welsh Rhyme Time raises awareness of the positive effects of sharing bilingual rhymes out loud with children. Reciting rhymes lays the foundation for developing children's speech and language, as well as their future relationship with reading. It can also be a fun, affordable bonding activity for families, which in turn helps support children's emotional development and self-confidence.

To support this year's celebration, former Bardd Plant Cymru **Casia Wiliam** has released a specially written poem. "All The Little Treasures", inspired by her own children's love of collecting things they find outside. The poem is available along with resources on the BookTrust Cymru website that schools, nurseries and families can use as inspiration for sharing bilingual rhymes, poems and songs together. This year's resources also include a bilingual farmyard-themed song by musicians **Babis Bach Babies** and a bilingual rhyming story by storyteller **Tamar Eluned Williams** – both created specifically for Big Welsh Rhyme Time.

Families and early years settings can take part in their own rhyming fun at home using the videos and downloadable resources that will be available at https://www.booktrust.org.uk/bigwelshrhymetime or @BookTrustCymru on X (formerly known as Twitter) and Facebook and are encouraged to share their own rhyming experiences on social media.

There's still time to get involved and show us how your children get on with their rhyming.
