Books to enjoy together

To find more books to enjoy with your child you'll find our pull out and keep book list in the centre pages of this booklet – you could take this along to the library where the friendly library staff can show you the children's books section and help you choose some books. You could also join in a rhyme and story time with other parents and children.

Tips to help you enjoy books together

Ask questions when you're looking at a book together – can they say what they see on the page? What do they think will happen next?

There's no wrong way to read a book

A fun rhyme can distract and cheer up a grumpy toddler

Bedtime stories can help calm and soothe

Do what works for you – reading together doesn't have to be perfect

Don't worry if your child doesn't seem to be listening

You could use toys or music while you share a story to make it more fun

Have fun! Make animal noises or sound effects these help bring the story to life and will make you both laugh

Try to find a time that works for you each day to share books, stories and rhymes

You don't have to sit still or be quiet – take books with you to the park, the shops or on the bus

If your child isn't enjoying the story, ask them to choose another book or try again another time

Other family members and friends can join in too

Every child is different and will enjoy different types of books and stories try something new



Tips to help you and your child choose books together

You could take this list to the library or book shop or use it to help search for books online. There are books about everything, explore these questions together to help find a new book to enjoy.

- Sharing stories, songs and rhymes with young children helps their development
- Children who read regularly are more likely to do better in school
- Sharing stories helps children understand the world around them and builds their imagination

- You don't have to pay to join and you can borrow books for free
- We don't charge fees for children's books that are returned late
- Join us for a friendly rhyme time or story time session where you can meet other parents and carers and share stories and rhymes with your children

- Ask us for books on parenting, dealing with tantrums, sleeping, behaviour and other issues

by Ellie Sandall


As a group of funny bunnies dance, sing, make music and have lots of fun, a cheeky fox watches them. This rhyming book is fun and has lovely illustrations.

by Katrina Sharman & Nick Sharratt


A sing-along picture book perfect for little ones who love vehicles. Bright illustrations of cars, buses, planes, trains, trucks and diggers.

by Libby Burns


Perfect for curious toddlers who love to explore nature. An interactive book with slides to pull to make puddles, clouds and rainbows appear in the magic windows.

by Carly Gledhill


Follow Frog on his travels. With shaped pages, folds and holes to peep through. Where will Frog end up?
