


Jump and Shout by Mike Dumbleton and Peter Carnavas



Talking - Ask your child to find things on the page. Can they spot the monkey or the balloon? Even if they can't yet say the word, they might be able to point at it.

Sharing - Why not have a fun day out like the children and read the book outside? You could go to the park or have a picnic!

Listening - Take your time when you're sharing this book. Children at this age need a bit more time to look at all the pictures and understand new words.









Talking - The children in this book are having an exciting day out. Talk to your child about a fun day that you have had together.

Sharing - Why not act out some of the words together? You could 'clap and cheer' or 'curl and roll' like the children!

Listening - Snuggle up close and share this book together, just like the family do on the last pages. You could even invite more of your family to join in.



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
