



## Voting Guidance for the BookTrust Storytime Prize 2024



## **Voting Guidance**

From 8 January 2024 you will be sent a link to access the online voting form to vote for your library's favourite of all six shortlisted titles. Please contact us if you have not received a voting link by **1 February 2024**.

It is very important that when completing the voting form that your library has shared all the five books with families. The voting form can only be completed once for each library participating in BookTrust Storytime.

The questions you will be asked about each shortlisted title are below:

- 1. When you first saw the books, which one did you most like the look of and want to share / read with your early years families?
- 2. Which book made early years families in your library most excited about reading?
- 3. Which book did the early years families you work with want to read again?
- 4. How enjoyable was the book as a shared reading experience for early years families? (Think about interactive elements, audience participation, rhyming, repetition etc...) 1 = extremely unenjoyable, 5 = extremely enjoyable
- 5. How much did the book offer opportunities for interaction between adult reader and child? 1 = no interaction, 5 = lots of interaction

- 6. How age appropriate was this book for the early years families you worked with? We know that some libraries have children from the full age range (0-5) using the BookTrust Storytime resources. If this is the case for you, please think about how easy it was to use this book across the full age spectrum of children. 1= very poor, 2= poor, 3= ok, 4= good, 5= excellent
- 7. Using your experience with the books and the Storytime sticker poster as guidance for this answer, please put the titles in the order you think the Prize should be awarded. The top title on your list should be the title you think should be the winner.

Please complete the voting form online as we're unable to accept physical print outs of the form sent to us. The closing date for completing the voting is **Friday 29 March 2024, 6pm GMT**. We're unable to accept votes submitted after this date.

## **The Winners**

Once the voting forms have been completed and received BookTrust will award one point for the responses to questions 1-3, along with the number of points given from answers 4-7 and will add up the number of points given to each book. The book with the highest number of points will win the BookTrust Storytime Prize 2024.
