How it works


- It's best to give these packs out to your class as soon as you receive them while children are still settling into their new school life.

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Ideas for using We're Going to Find the Monster! in your classroom



Use the book to talk to your class about the animal kingdom

In the book we see many wild animals on Charlie's and Eddie's journey. Try theming a lesson around the different animal groups from mammals to birds.



Messages on a white board

Mix up some magnetic letters on a white board and ask your class to form words. They could even be related to characters or animals in the story.

Creative writing

Ask your class to design their own adventure. Who would your class like to meet if they were on their very own journey?

Maths

Introduce animals into your maths lessons. How many penguins are in a waddle? How many whales in a pod? How many wolves form a pack?



Create a display

Draw an outline of a big map. Talk about the different places from the story such as the high mountains or shimmering ocean, then ask your class to draw these, colour them in and cut them out to be added to the display.
